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FOLLOWING ROOT CANAL TREATMENT

Root Canal treatment has been performed on your tooth today. Because of the original condition of the tooth and the manipulation from today's procedure, *the tooth and the surrounding gum may be tender for a few days*. For proper healing and relief of symptoms, please read the following instructions:

- 1. PAIN MEDICATION Start medication as directed before anesthetic wears off.
 - A. Anti-inflammatory Pain Medication-prevents and reduced inflammation and pain from the teeth and surrounding tissues.
 - Ibuprofen (example-Advil, Motrin)
 - Take 400mg every 4 hrs., 600mg every 6 hrs. or 800mg prescription every 8hrs.
 - Do not exceed 3200 mg per day OR
 - Naproxen (Aleve) 220 mg every 12 hours.
 - B. Acetaminophen (example-Tylenol) If unable to use anti-inflammatory or narcotic medicines.
 - *Take two 325 mg or one 500mg every 6 hours
 - * Do not exceed 3000 mg. per day
 - * Avoid alcoholic beverages
 - * Can be used in between doses of anti-inflammatory medication instead of narcotic
- 2. **ANTIBIOTICS-**If prescribed, take as directed to help eliminate infection.
- 3. Do not eat and/or drink hot foods or liquids until the numbness wears off. This will prevent biting/burning of the cheek or tongue. Avoid chewing with that tooth for 24 hrs.
- 4. Brush teeth as usual to keep the area clean.
- 5. Call your primary dentist for an appointment to proceed with the final restoration. Our staff will forward the final Endodontic report to your primary dental office.
- 6. If the tooth becomes very uncomfortable or swelling develops, PLEASE CALL OUR OFFICE!
